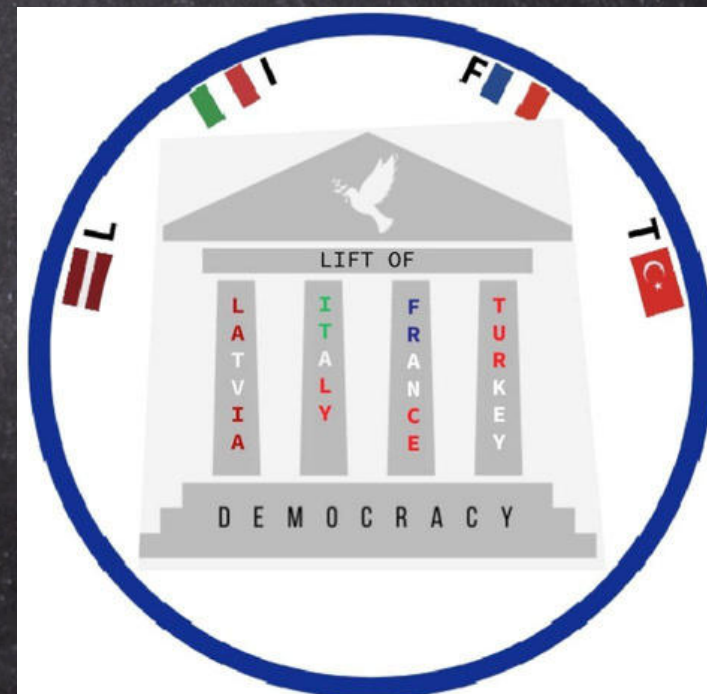




ERASMUS+ PROJECT IN LATVIA

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FIRST DAY

The last project mobility was from March 31 to April 5. On the first day, the guests were welcomed by the school principal Kristīne Ivancova.

Then, 12th grade students conducted master classes "Inclusive Education" and "Children's Rights School". In the second half of the day, the project participants visited, meeting with the city mayor Andrejs Elksniņš. Then, for an hour and a half, they got to know the main sights of Daugavpils.



SECONT DAY

The second day began with master classes “Violations of Minority Rights” and “Court Protection and Human Rights Organizations”.

In the afternoon, the project participants visited the Mark Rothko Art Center, where they had the opportunity to participate in a painting workshop. The guests were given a tour of the fortress, where the guide gave an exciting talk about its attractions.



THIRD DAY

On the third day, mobility participants went on an excursion to the Andrupene ethnic farm, where they were offered to bake their own traditional Latvian rye bread.

The guests ALSO visited the Aglona Basilica and King Jesus Hill.

Along the way, the participants also visited the Daugavpils Church Hill AND visited the prayer houses of all religious denominations in the city in a short time.



FOURTH DAY

The fourth day was spent at Daugavpils Friendly Call Secondary School. Mobility participants participated in master classes “Violation of Freedom” and “Violation of the Rights of Assembly and Association”. The young people also performed traditional folk dances and games of their countries. Project participants discussed the final product they created – the electronic magazine “LIFT of Democracy”. At the end of the day, all mobility participants were awarded certificates.



FIFTH DAY

The fifth day of the project was spent in the capital city of Riga.

Students and teachers visited the Latvian Parliament, the Constitutional Court, and the Barricades Museum.

The project participants took photos at the Freedom Monument. The guests were amazed by the beauty of the cobbled streets of Old Riga, the grandeur of Riga Dome and St. Peter's Cathedrals, as well as the House of Blackheads.
